Cl. 119 PRESENTATION BY STUART WILLIAMS, CAMBRIAN RAIL PARTNERSHIP

11.12.19 Stuart Williams, General Manager of the Tal y Llyn Railway and Chairman of the Cambrian Rail Partnership (CRP) addressed the Council and gave details of his organisation and the ways in which it would be able to help the local community. He outlined the plans for the railway station since Transport for Wales (TfW) took over during the Spring and reported on the ways that CRP have been encouraging TfW to improve the service for example, by ensuring that the service is 'Dementia Ready' and that the Orange Wallets for those with special needs are fully understood.

Three key points emerged from his presentation;

- Regarding the station 'adoption' as resolved by the Council Cl.95 09.10.19, Mr. Williams stated that it would require planting, volunteers and that Tywyn was the largest previously un-adopted station on the Cambrian line.
- The Station Buildings are to be the subject of a community consultation process to decide on their best use. This is likely be a 'Dragon's Den' style pitching activity.
- Transport for Wales have a Community Fund available for community projects.

In response to Councillor's questions Mr. Williams confirmed that there were no plans to re-build the Shelter with the columns, that the grant was likely to be in the region of £5k, that the two sides of the station buildings were likely to be let separately and that preference would be given to community projects.
